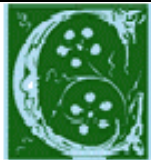

WEEKLY REFLECTION

20th WEEK IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR B

As the countdown to our weekly sessions on Confirmation come very close to Bishop Luc's visit at the end of the month of August, we ask our school community – and indeed the wider parish – to pray for all our Confirmandi. Confirmation takes place on Sunday 30th August.

This is a special time for these young people. **Amid the call to sporting fixtures, to family commitments and the continuous hectic lives** we all seem to lead, as we come before the Lord and by the Holy Spirit we are introduced more fully to the faith we profess. By this same Holy Spirit that hovered over the waters of our Baptism and in the name of the Trinity by which we were blessed, and hovered over the waters at the beginning of all creation, we come before God, **humble and contrite**, desirous of being in union with God in all we do.

We could always put it off until the next year, but our faith may not be as strong next year to compete with all that happens around us, and complete the preparation period. **Our desire is to be full members of the Church.** It is our desire to be blessed by the Holy Spirit, continue to take up our cross daily and follow the Lord.

Our School prayers should be directed this way for the next few weeks at least! And after, we should pray more fervently, more inclusively of our parish, more lovingly and more joyfully – for that is why we are here: to enter as fully as possible into the loving life of our Lord, to share the Spirit of joy that only God can contain, and to **enter into loving service** of that faithful *mystery* that alone is God.

May the Spirit cleanse and guide our inspiration and desire of a full, a complete life in God. **May we be renewed with a song on our lips every day** for the rest of our lives; and may that same Spirit, when that time comes engage our soul so closely that we are able to say: My Lord and my God as we turn to an eternity of loving union with God and all the Saints of Heaven.
