WEEKLY REFLECTION

21ST WEEK IN ORDINARY TIME , YEAR B/1

Our continued prayers are asked for as our Confirmation youths are in their last week of preparation. Our bishop, Bishop Luc Matthys, will arrive to be in Mungindi on Friday and then return to Moree for Confirmation here on Sunday, 11:00am, 30th August, 2009. We really value his presence in our midst.

These youths in their preparation time have been looking at the final stage of formal initiation into the Catholic Church. They are already members and will celebrate their Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist in a special way.

In the Sacrament of Confirmation these youth will renew that promise made for them or by them at their Baptism. As well, they will profess the faith they have continued to choose, by saying I do after the Bishop's homily and questions on our faith.

In the ceremony the Bishop will say the youth's Confirmation Name and then say, *be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit*. The candidate will respond with the word AMEN (which means: "Let it be as you have said"). The Bishop will then touch the cheek of each youth and say: *Peace be with you*, to which the youth will respond: And also with you.

Here is our Blessing for these youths:

God, we want to feel the impact of your power upon our lives. We want to respond to your life-giving Spirit.

Grant us the gift of Wisdom, so that we may know that all life comes from you, and therefore is sacred.

Secondary Scholarship

The Moree branch of the Country Women's Association of NSW is once again offering a scholarship to assist a student who is not eligible for other forms of financial assistance to undertake Year 7 at one of the High Schools in Moree.

Financial assistance will be provided to the awardee for 4 years, being from Year 7 to Year 10 & will be reviewed each year.

Our Mission is to provide students with a Catholic Education in a caring, disciplined environment where striving for excellence and respect for others are promoted.

To be eligible, the student must:

1. Enrol at either Moree Secondary College, St Philomena's Secondary School, or the Christian Secondary School
2. Live within the Moree Plains Shire
3. Not receive any other form of financial assistance for schooling.

Students in Year 6 in Primary Schools that "feed" Moree High Schools may submit an application through the Principal of their school.

The committee will select the student who is to be awarded the scholarship.

Selection Criteria:

1. Academic effort as shown by the student's performance during all of Year 6
2. Service to the life of the school
3. Financial need of the family.

Comments made by the School Principal will be taken into consideration.

The successful student will be required to submit a report to the CWA each year covering progress for the duration of the scholarship. Failure to do this could result in the scholarship being cancelled.

*Application forms are available through the school office and should be submitted via the Principal for consideration. They need to be received by the school no later than **Monday 14th September 2009**. Late applications will not be considered.*

AUSTRALIAN VETERANS' CHILDREN ASSISTANCE TRUST

Scholarships for Children of Veterans intending Tertiary Studies in 2010

In 2010 the Australian Veterans' Children Assistance Trust (AVCAT) are expecting to give financial assistance for up to 65 students under many different scholarship schemes. All schemes help the selected children in need of the Australian veteran community with the costs of tertiary education. Applicants are considered for all schemes for which they are eligible. Applications open on 18 August 2009.

The largest scheme is the Long Tan Bursary funded by the Australian Government. There are 50 new bursaries each year. They are valued at \$9,000 each which paid at \$3,000 per year for three years. There are selection number targets for each State and Territory. To apply you must be the child of an Australian Vietnam Veteran, be resident in Australia, be entering any year of tertiary study, having not previously received a Long Tan Bursary. The other national schemes are the AVCAT Bursary, the two RSL Scholarships, three Vietnam Veterans' Peacekeepers and Peacemakers Scholarship and the Defence Force Welfare Association Scholarship. George Quinsey Scholarships directly pay tuition fees for economics, commerce and accountancy studies. There are also regional scholarships. In NSW, there are three from Brisbane Water Legacy covering Gosford/Wyong NSW and two from the NSW TPI Association. Some private donors offer two scholarships to resident NSW applicants.

Schemes vary between \$3,000 and \$5,000 per year each. Some are restricted to location of residence or studies. Most require veteran service in Vietnam but others are broader. To receive an application form register interest on 1800 620 361. Children and grandchildren of Vietnam veterans should do so now, as should any others who believe that they are eligible.
